## HICKS LANDSCAPES

Ken Muellers, senior landscape designer at Hicks Landscapes, conceived a design scheme that incorporates the cottage's existing herringbone brick walkway and bluestone terrace with rows of 'Green Velvet' boxwood, planters featuring coral bells, ornamental cabbage and kale, and decorative grasses, and *Taxus baccata* 'Fastigiata' flanking the front door. "We wanted to set the tone for a home that is being rejuvenated and brought back to life," says Muellers.

Among these are the Colonial Revival Summer Cottage, built by architect John Russell Pope in the mid-1930s for department store heir Marshall Field. The interior and exterior spaces were recently reimagined by 17 design firms for the spectacular Caumsett Designer Showhouse, presented by design media sponsor NYC&G and benefiting the Caumsett Foundation. For these two neighboring spaces, Alanna Albanese opted for a black-and-white palette accented with seascape paintings by local artist Susan Graham Switala. The designer kept storage top of mind, adding extra shelving for towels in the laundry room and a skirt to the linen room's original farmhouse sink to hide cleaning supplies.
