Situated on approximately 1,500 wooded acres, Caumsett State Historic Park Preserve in Lloyd Harbor, Long Island, is a vision to behold, including the historic structures that dot the property. Among these are the Colonial Revival Summer Cottage, built by architect John Russell Pope in the mid-1930s for department store heir Marshall Field. The interior and exterior spaces were recently reimagined by 17 design firms for the spectacular Caumsett Designer Showhouse, presented by design media sponsor NYC&G and benefiting the Caumsett Foundation. HICKS LANDSCAPES FRONT TERRACE

Ken Muellers, senior landscape designer at Hicks Landscapes, conceived a design scheme that incorporates the cottage's existing herringbone brick walkway and bluestone terrace with rows of 'Green Velvet' boxwood, planters featuring coral bells, ornamental cabbage and kale, and decorative grasses, and *Taxus baccata* 'Fastigiata' flanking the front door. "We wanted to set the tone for a home that is being rejuvenated and brought back to life," says Muellers.

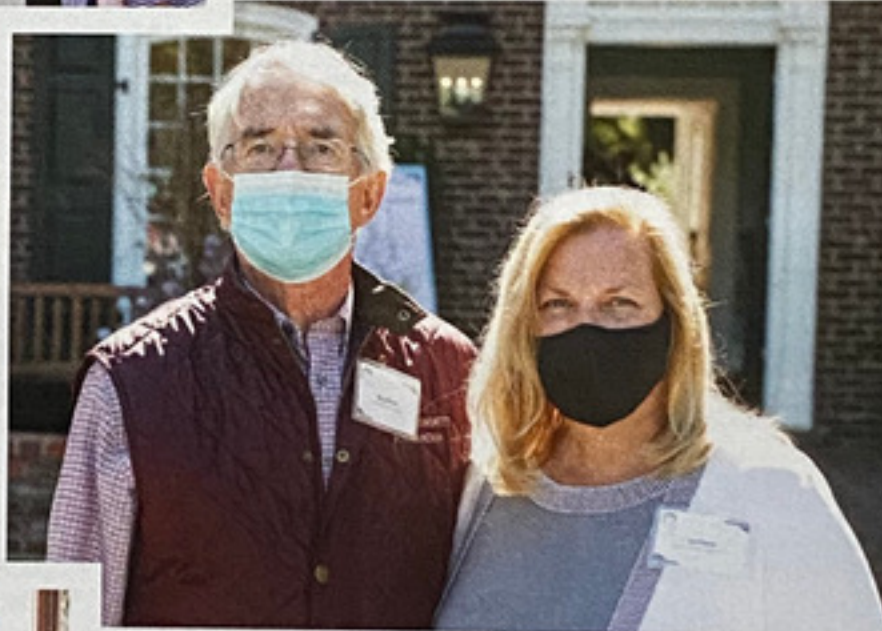
